

THE MINOR PROPHETS

- → Which books are the "minor prophets"?
 - Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi
 - "Book of the 12"
- → Why are they called "minor"?
 - They are generally shorter than the preceding prophetic books.
 - It has nothing to do with the significance of their content.







WHY STUDY THE MINOR PROPHETS?

- → The New Testament authors frequently reference them.
 - Habakkuk 2.4 Romans 1; Galatians 3; Hebrews 10
 - Malachi 3.1 Matthew 11; Mark 1; Luke 7
- → They were written for our instruction, to give us hope.
 - Romans 15.4
- → There are examples in them, intended to enlighten us.
 - I Corinthians I0.11


READ ACTS 13.16-42


